Point 3 - Genesis 22:16

"I (God) will *multiply your seed.*" (see N. T. lesson)

- 1. When did Isaac die and resurrect in the mind of Abraham? (Please read Hebrews 11:17-19 and Genesis 22:2 and 22:4 before you answer)
- 2. What does the death and resurrection of Jesus (and Isaac as a type) mean to everyone who believes?

# "Salvation through his only Son"

This week's lesson is designed to have you compare Abraham offering Isaac on Mt. Moriah with our Heavenly Father offering Jesus on that same mountain as the sacrifice offering salvation to all mankind. Specifically, we compare the idea of "Your only begotten Son" in this week's lesson. Please notice the exact detailed fulfillment in the New Testament of over 30 separate items found in Genesis 22:1-19. One of those details is this lesson on "Your only Son."

Family Reading (to be read aloud): John 3:1-21

Key Characters: God, Jesus and Nicodemus

Key Verse: John 3:16 (memory verse, see page 18 and memory card)

#### **His Only Son**

*Point 1* - The Heavenly Father *loves* his only begotten son.

Testimony of John John 3:35

Testimony of Jesus John 5:20 (Son loves Father - John 14:31)

Reason for love John 10:17

Point 2 - The Heavenly Father <u>gave</u> his only begotten son.

Isaac is a type of Jesus bearing his cross.

Point 2 - Genesis 22:6

"Isaac *carried the wood* up the hill." (see N. T. lesson)

Point 3 - Hebrews 11:17 (memory verse, see page 18 and memory card)

"Abraham *offered Isaac as the sacrifice.*" (see N. T. lesson)

- 1. Why does the Bible stress the fact that Abraham was willing to sacrifice his son in Genesis 22? Did Abraham believe in the resurrection according to Hebrews 11:17-19?
- 2. Are the mountains called Moriah in the Old Testament and Golgotha in the New Testament different mountains? No! (See page 13)

Purpose: To review what Isaiah preached regarding the crucifixion

Family Reading (to be read aloud): Isaiah 52:13 - 53:12

Key Character: God the Father, Jesus the Messiah, we the sheep

Key Verse: Isaiah 53:5 (memory verse, see page 18 and memory card)

Truth to be learned and applied:

Isaiah spoke about the Messiah suffering from man's sins over 700 years before Calvary.

#### The Suffering Servant

Point 1 - Isaiah 52:14

"The Messiah was *disfigured and marred*." (see N. T. lesson)

Point 2 - Isaiah 53:7

"The Messiah *did not open his mouth.*" (see N. T. lesson)

Point 3 - Isaiah 53:9

"The Messiah was assigned a grave of the rich." (see N. T. lesson)

- 1. After reading Isaiah 52:13 53:12, how do you suppose Isaiah could speak in the past tense about the crucifixion which did not occur for 700 years after Isaiah's death?
- 2. How many details about the crucifixion can you find mentioned in Isaiah 52:13 53:12? Make a separate list on a piece of paper and keep it with this lesson.

# "Fulfilled Prophecies of Suffering"

Purpose: To show the accuracy of Isaiah's "Suffering Servant" prophecies

Family Reading (to be read aloud): Matthew 27:11-61

Key Characters: Jesus, Joseph, Pilate, Herod

Truth to be learned and applied:

We know that our old self was crucified with Jesus so that we no longer have to serve sin

#### "Isaac's Resurrection"

Purpose: To show the similarities between Isaac's resurrection and that of Jesus

Family Reading (to be read aloud): Genesis 22:1-19

Key Characters: Abraham, Isaac, Servants

Key Verse: Hebrews 11:19

Memory Verse: Hebrews 9:27-28 (memory verse, see page 18 and memory card)

Truth to be learned and applied:

The purpose of the resurrection is to be reunited with the LORD.

#### The Resurrection

Point 1 - Genesis 22:4

"Abraham saw *on the third day.*" (see N. T. lesson)

Point 2 - Genesis 22:5

"Abraham *promised to return* with Isaac." (see N. T. lesson)

Point 3 - Genesis 22:19

"Abraham and Isaac <u>returned.</u>" (see N. T. lesson)

- 1. After considering carefully Hebrews 11:17-19, discuss how Abraham considered Isaac dead as soon as God asked him to sacrifice Isaac, and "seeing" the place in three days.
- 2. Look at Acts 1:9-11 and I John 3:2 and meditate upon the Lord's return to meet you! Your meditation should reveal God's intended purpose just for you. Praise His holy name!

#### "Jesus' Resurrection"

Purpose: To live a new life as did Jesus when He arose from the dead

Family Reading (to be read aloud): I Corinthians 15

Key Characters: Jesus, Mary of Magdala, Thomas, the Disciples

Truth to be learned and applied:

Jesus died - we died with Him, Jesus was buried - we were buried with Him, Jesus resurrected - we are raised to new life.



#### **CULTURE**

#### Child Sacrifice to the god Athtar (Molech or Chemosh)

Children were sacrificed to the god, Molech, in the valley of Ben Hinnom. This valley is just south of the mountain, Moriah. Molech is the title of the Venus Star god of the Ammonites whose name is "Athtar." Athtar is called by the Moabites, "Chemosh," but it is the same god. It must be noted here that the Ammonites and Moabites are the incestual descendents of Lot and his two daughters (Genesis 19:30-38). Topeth means: "Firepit."

#### **Worship of Molech Forbidden**

Do not give any of your children to be sacrificed to Molech for you must not profane the name of your God. I am the LORD.

Leviticus 18:21

The Lord said to Moses, "Say to the Israelites: 'Any Israelite or any alien living in Israel who gives any of his children to Molech must be put to death. The people of the community are to stone him.'"

Leviticus 20:1-2

#### Solomon's Sin

On a hill east of Jerusalem, Solomon built a high place for Chemosh the detestable god of Moab, and for Molech the detestable god of the Ammonites.

#### **King Josiah Destroys Altar to Molech**


He (Josiah) desecrated Topheth, which was in the Valley of Ben Hinnom, so no one could use it to sacrifice his son or daughter in the fire to Molech.

II Kings 23:10

Some have tried to compare the offering of Isaac by Abraham on Mt. Moriah to the offering of children to Molech in the valley of Hinnom. The only comparison is that children are involved. Molech is a false god of the Venus Star. Jehovah is the only true God who asked Abraham to offer his son, Isaac, as a living sacrifice. In Abraham's mind, Isaac died the day God asked him to offer him. Three days later, Isaac resurrected! He never died! The substitutionary sacrifice was there all the time! That ram is God's son, Yeshua! Jesus said, "Your father Abraham rejoiced to see my day: and saw *it*, and was glad." The fact is, Abraham saw the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus and was saved! This makes the story of Isaac a "type" of the story of Jesus and the event on Mt. Moriah, Isaac's resurrection.

## **BIOGRAPHIES**

#### **Abraham and Isaac**



Abraham married his half-sister, Sarah. They both had Terah as their father, but had different mothers. Abraham and Sarah had a son, Isaac.

Nahor (Abraham's 1st brother) married his niece, Milcah, daughter of Haran (Abraham's 2nd brother). Nahor and Milcah had a son, Bethuel.

Bethuel had a daughter, Rebekah. Isaac married Rebekah who was his cousin twice removed. Isaac and Rebekah had twin sons, Esau and Jacob.

Bethuel also had a son, Laban. Laban had two daughters, Leah and Rachel. Jacob married both of his cousins, Leah and Rachel. Jacob and Leah had six sons: Rueben, Simeon, Issachar, Zebulun, Levi and Judah. Jacob and Leah's maid, Zilpah, had two sons, Gad and Asher. Jacob and Rachel had two sons, Joseph and Benjamin. Jacob and Rachel's maid, Bilhah, had two sons, Dan and Naphtali.

For these four weeks, each member of your family should practice the first five letters of the Hebrew alphabet. Each person should be able to say, write and identify these first five letters.

In addition, each member should know the first three vowel signs by shape, name and sound. Each one should be able to use them with each of the first five letters to reproduce the correct sound.

Finally, each member should learn the five vocabulary words below using the first five Hebrew letters and the first three vowel sounds. They should know how to pronounce them and know their English meaning.
